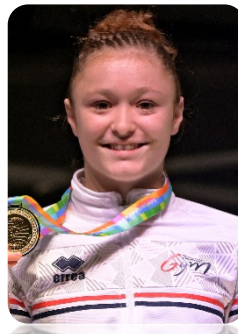

Some competition facts:

- No tie at medal places
- Two inquiries during the full competition (both rejected)
- In individual trampoline, only one man and two women did not take part in the second exercise of Q1.

Judge activity:

Number of judges per Categories:

- DMT: 12 judges (2 Cat 1, 2 Cat.2 and 8 Cat.3)
- Tumbling: 13 judges (2 Cat 1, 6 Cat.2 and 5 Cat.3)
- Trampoline: 36 judges (6 Cat.1, 23 Cat.2, and 7 Cat.3)



The competition went smoothly. We only had an issue with the HTMD device (two times we did not receive a score from the machine), and we had to recalculate it with the Swiss Timing backup device. This device, due to the difference in technology, does not give such an accurate score as the HTMD machine and will be improved. Swiss timing and TC are working together to make it even more reliable.

Incomplete exercises during trampoline competition:

We still had an important number of incomplete exercises, but not as much as the previous world championships, gymnasts in this Olympic qualifying year performed more secure exercises and looked well prepared. This is especially true for Q2 exercises, where Olympic qualification took place.
